CREATORS' NOTE

I Wish is the brainchild of three artists, bringing together our views, experiences and questions of the world through song, fairytale and magic.

The pandemic brought together many artists who had never before collaborated, working in new artforms. Two of us—Rachel and Le Gateau—were lucky to be paired together to work on an online film project for Unicorn Theatre. We quickly hit it off and connected over our shared views of the world and excitement making work for young audiences.

Through sharing our unique experiences of the world, the two of us dreamed up a show that introduced our audience to reimagining fairytales and what the cost of the perfect version of life is. What really happens when you get what you wish for? The story of Effie, our "Wish Giver," explores the darker side of wishes and the cost of magicking our problems away.

I Wish is a first encounter for young audiences with the wonderful world of musical theater and cabaret. We knew instantly that we had to bring Seiriol Davies, writer and composer, on board, whose songs and lyrics transport us into this world of wishes, magic and sequins.

The three of us knew we wanted this story to be fun, magical and full of hope. This is a tale for our rapidly changing world, designed to awaken activism and action in children and young audiences. What happens if we shift from *I* Wish to We Wish? What can we achieve when we all work together? What doors can we open as a collective?

Using timeless fairytales, *I Wish* takes new perspectives on existing stories, inviting our audiences to experience the world through fresh eyes.

We can't wait for you to meet Effie, and for I Wish to become We Wish for you.

What do you hope kids will take away from this show?

I hope kids take away the message of strength in community. When we come together anything is possible.

Who is your favorite fairy-tale character and why?

My favorite character would have to be John Pan because I can relate to his frustration of wanting to march to the beat of his own drum!

What is the strongest magic of all?

The strongest magic is our differences. They should be celebrated and encouraged—your uniqueness is your superpower!

Julian Clary (Narrator) began working on the cabaret circuit in the early 80s as The Joan Collins Fan Club. Following an appearance on Saturday Night Live, Channel 4 offered him his own show, Sticky Moments. More TV followed, including Terry and Julian, All Rise for Julian Clary, Prickly Heat, It's Only TV But I Like It, Strictly Come Dancing, Have I Got News For You, Who Do You Think You Are?, QI, Celebrity Big Brother, Your Face Sounds Familiar, Piers Morgan's Life Stories, Give a Pet a Home, Nature Nuts and Passions, Taskmaster,

Masked Singer Christmas Special. Theater includes: Leigh Bowery in Boy George's Taboo (West End and UK tour), the Emcee in Rufus Norris's Olivier Award-winning production of Kander and Ebb's Cabaret (West End) and Le Grand Mort (Trafalgar Studios), Norman in The Dresser (National Tour), Bleak Expectations (West End), Herod, Jesus Christ Superstar (National Tour). Julian is a regular panelist on Radio 4's Just a Minute. His writing includes his memoir The Lick of Love, A Young Man's Passage, several adult novels and his on-going series for children, The Bolds. His latest adult novel Curtain Call to Murder will be published in October 2024. In December 2023 Julian appeared in Peter Pan, his eighth consecutive appearance at The London Palladium. He will tour the UK this spring with his latest one-man show, A Fistful of Clary.

MEET THE CREATIVE AND PRODUCTION TEAM

Le Gateau Chocolat (Co-Creator) is one of the only performers in Britain with a significant and concurrent profile in drag, cabaret, opera, musical theater, children's theater and live art. Gateau's solo theatrical works/performances range from song cycles and straight concerts to the political; engaging with his and other marginalized identities. Some of his works include BLACK (2014 Homotopia commission), which toured with Psappha in 2017 and was supported by both The Wellcome Trust and Arts Council England; DUCKIE (2016) his first family show, and ICONS (2017) which has toured globally and with his all-Women-of-Colour "Little Coco Orchestra." Gateau has

also been invited to perform in Emma Rice's Twelfth Night, in Taylor Mac's 24-Decade History of Popular Music, and Tannhäuser at Bayreuth Festival, among many others.

Rachel Bagshaw (Director and Co-Creator) is an award-winning stage director. She was recently appointed Artistic Director of Unicorn Theatre having been their Associate Director from 2018 to 2023. She is also an Associate at the National Theatre as a recipient of the Peter Hall Bursary for 2023-24. Rachel is making her directorial debut at the Globe Theatre in 2024 directing The Duchess of Malfi on the Sam Wanamaker stage. Recent productions include A Dead Body in Taos (Bristol Old Vic/ Wilton's Music Hall), Augmented by Sophie Woolley (Royal Exchange/Told by an Idiot), Philip Pullman's Grimm Tales and Greek Myths Unplugged, Let Loose (with Choreographer Arielle Smith, co-produced with English National Ballet), for Unicorn Theatre Online. Other theater credits include Midnight Movie (Royal Court Theatre), The Bee in Me and Aesop's Fables (Unicorn Theatre), Resonance at the Still Point of Change (Unlimited Festival, South Bank Centre), The Rhinestone Rollers and Just Me, Bell (Graeae). Her critically acclaimed work The Shape of the Pain won a Fringe First at Edinburgh and was revived at Battersea Arts Centre in 2018. Film credits includes Let Loose (Unicorn Theatre Online/ENB) and Where I Go (When I Can't be Where I Am) (BBC/China Plate).

Seiriol Davies (Music, Lyrics and Co-Creator) is an award-winning writer, composer and performer from Ynys Môn. They created the cult hit musical How To Win Against History, which had two sell-out runs at Edinburgh Fringe, before touring the UK and transferring to the Young Vic, securing Seiriol a UK Theatre Award nomination for best performance in a musical. Other work includes the fabulous comedy Milky Peaks, which premiered at Theatr Clwyd and toured Wales to great acclaim, with Seiriol named "the 21st century's post-modern Ivor Novello;" also Effigies of Wickedness: Songs Banned by the Nazis (English National Opera / The Gate) for which Seiriol provided the critically-lauded lyrics. Most recently, Seiriol co-created and co-starred with Maxine Peake in Betty! A Sort of Musical, about Betty Boothroyd, at The Royal Exchange, Manchester. The show was a smash hit, and even got mentioned in the House of Commons. They were named one of The Stage 25: 25 artists tipped to be future stars of theater. They are currently working on a glittering fantasy about Owain Glyndŵr and Henry the Fifth, as well as a queer wrestling musical (with actual wrestling!) and much more on stage and screen.



Land Acknowledgement

We are on the island known as Mannahatta, now called Manhattan, in Lenapehoking, the homeland of the Lenape people. These lands are intertribal trade lands under the stewardship of many Nations, and New Victory acknowledges the systematic erasure of their true history.

The land of the five boroughs that make up New York City was and still is inhabited by the Lenape, Merrick, Canarsie, Rockaway and Matinecock Nations. We celebrate and pay deep respect to the Peoples of these Nations, their cultures, their communities, their elders past and present, those with us today, and all their future generations.

We recognize that seized lands are historically inhabited by people who are racialized, marginalized and displaced by those in power, and we offer this land acknowledgement as a step in reexamining our relationship to that history. We offer our gratitude to the Indigenous peoples of many the Nations who continue to act as stewards of the land, and we encourage you to learn more about these vibrant communities.







BROADWAY TO BURLESQUE

This theater was built in 1900 by Oscar Hammerstein I as the Theatre Republic. On the roof, he created the Paradise Gardens, which featured a stage, dance floor and a miniature Dutch village. In 1902, impresario David Belasco bought the venue, gave it his name and installed an orchestra pit. In the 1930s Billy Minsky turned the theater into Broadway's first burlesque club, Minsky's Republic, which boasted showgirls and a flashy façade.



SILVER SCREEN

In 1942, Mayor LaGuardia banned burlesque, and Minsky's was no more. In a burst of WWII patriotism, the theater was renamed The Victory and showed first-run films. Over the next 30 years, Times Square declined into abject decay. In 1972, the theater became the block's only XXX-rated movie house.



NEW VICTORY

The theater as it is known today opened in 1995 as the city's first theater for children and families. As one of seven restored theaters under New 42's stewardship, the New Victory is just one way in which the New 42 makes the arts a part of everyone's life from the earliest years onward!



LOOK UP! The dome and all of the putti—the cherubs smiling down on you—are original to the theater.


